- 3 FOR the purpose of providing for a civil penalty for a violation of certain laws relating
- 4 to outdoor advertising on highways; establishing a rebuttable presumption, for
- 5 purposes of the civil penalty, that an outdoor sign erected in violation of certain
- 6 laws relating to outdoor advertising on highways was erected by the person
- 7 being advertised by the sign; establishing that a person may not be subject to a
- 8 civil penalty if the person has been prosecuted for a violation of certain laws
- 9 relating to outdoor advertising; and generally relating to a civil penalty for a
- violation of certain laws relating to outdoor advertising on highways.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) [Any] UNLESS THE PERSON HAS PAID A CIVIL PENALTY UNDER
- 21 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE SAME VIOLATION, ANY person who
- 22 violates any provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is
- 23 subject to a fine not exceeding \$500.
- 24 (B) (1) UNLESS THE PERSON HAS BEEN PROSECUTED UNDER SUBSECTION
- 25 (A) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE SAME VIOLATION, A PERSON WHO ERECTS A SIGN IN
- 26 VIOLATION OF A PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A CIVIL
- 27 PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$100.

- 1 (2) FOR PURPOSES OF THE CIVIL PENALTY PROVIDED IN THIS
- $2\,$ SUBSECTION ONLY, THERE SHALL BE A REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION THAT AN
- 3 OUTDOOR SIGN ERECTED IN VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE WAS
- 4 ERECTED BY THE PERSON BEING ADVERTISED BY THE SIGN.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2001.
