

FROM AMONG THE PROPOSALS SUBMITTED, MAY 1 2 FORWARD THE A FINAL PROPOSAL TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR APPROVAL BY AUGUST 3 45 JANUARY 15 OF EACH YEAR. - 1 (VI) FIELD TRIPS TO LOCATIONS DESCRIBED IN THE FINAL 2 PROPOSAL. A COUNTY BOARD SHALL INCLUDE IN A FINAL PROPOSAL THE 4 ESTIMATED COST OF EXTENDING THE CONTRACTS OF PARTICIPATING TEACHERS. - 25 effect October 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end
- 26 of September 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 27 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
