CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education - Baltimore City - Public School Construction**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a certain State/local cost sharing formula for public  
4 school construction projects in Baltimore City for certain fiscal years; requiring  
5 Baltimore City to appropriate a certain amount of funds for school construction  
6 in certain years; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating  
7 to public school construction in Baltimore City.

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
9 MARYLAND, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, for fiscal years 2002  
10 ~~through 2006~~ and 2003, in each year, the State shall provide 90 percent of the eligible  
11 costs for up to and including ~~\$35~~ \$15 \$20 million in public school construction projects  
12 in Baltimore City, and for funding above ~~\$35~~ \$15 \$20 million, the State shall provide  
13 75 percent of the eligible costs.

1     SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the  
2 provisions of Section 1 of this Act, Baltimore City shall appropriate for school  
3 construction in fiscal 2002 and 2003, in each year, at least \$12.4 million, the amount  
4 that Baltimore City appropriated in fiscal 2001 to match the State funds provided in  
5 fiscal 2001 for school construction in Baltimore City.

6     SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take  
7 effect July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of ~~5~~ 2 years and, at the end of  
8 June 30, ~~2006~~, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this  
9 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
