A BILL ENTITLED

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- 2 Department of Natural Resources Oysters Harvesting Areas and Seed 3 Areas
- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to plant
- 5 oysters, shells, or other cultch or take any other restorative measures in areas
- designated by the Department; requiring that the first of a certain number of
- 7 seed oysters produced in seed areas that are designated by the Department for a
- 8 certain purpose shall be planted on natural oyster bars of the State; authorizing
- 9 the Department to designate oyster seed areas for aquaculture purposes;
- authorizing the Department to designate portions of certain oyster seed areas
- for the production of seed for a certain use; altering the amount of seed oysters
- the State may sell to certain individuals under certain circumstances;
- increasing the number of acres that the Department may establish as
- aquaculture seed areas; and generally relating to the production of oysters.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22 Article Natural Resources
- 23 4-1103.
- 24 (a) The Department shall take measures which in its judgment seem best
- 25 calculated to increase the productivity or utility of any part of the natural oyster bars
- 26 of the State.
- 27 (b) The Department may close in any year no more than 30 percent of the
- 28 natural oyster bars in the waters of the State. The Department may prohibit or
- 29 restrict the catching of oysters on natural oyster bars whenever in its judgment these

- 1 measures will increase the productivity or utility of these areas. The Department may
- 2 plant oysters, shells, or other cultch or take any other restorative measures, which it
- 3 deems advisable, on natural oyster bars OR OTHER AREAS DESIGNATED BY THE
- 4 DEPARTMENT. The Department shall publish a notice of intent to close any area of a
- 5 natural oyster bar not less than 30 days prior to the proposed closing date in one or
- 6 more newspapers of general circulation in each county of the State. The Department
- 7 shall schedule a public hearing on the proposal not less than 15 days before the
- $8\,$ proposed closing date. The hearing shall be held at the county seat of the county in
- $9\,$ which the affected waters are located. If the affected waters are located in more than
- 10 one county then the hearing shall be held in that county seat closest to the affected
- 11 waters. If the area affected is totally within State waters, then the hearing shall be
- 12 held in Annapolis.
- 13 (c) The Department may reopen an area if it determines reopening is
- 14 advisable. An area shall be reopened by notice of reopening published in the same
- 15 newspapers that published any closing notices. However, an area may not be
- 16 reopened until a lapse of 48 hours from the publication of the notice of reopening.
- 17 (d) The Department may select and reserve for its own use areas, to be known
- 18 as seed areas, within the waters of the State for the propagation of seed oysters. The
- 19 number, size, and location of these areas shall be determined from time to time by the
- 20 Department. However, no more than 5 percent of the natural oyster bars of the State
- 21 shall be designated as seed areas. The first million bushels of seed oysters produced
- 22 in seed areas DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PUBLIC FISHERY shall be
- 23 planted on the natural oyster bars of the State. The Department shall publish a notice
- 24 of reservation not less than 30 days before the closing date of any seed area in one
- 25 newspaper of general circulation in the State and at least one newspaper of general
- 26 circulation in each county of the State. The Department shall schedule a public
- 27 hearing on the proposal not less than 15 days before the proposed closing date. The
- 28 hearing shall be held at the county seat of the county in which the affected waters are
- 29 located. If the affected waters are located in more than one county, the hearing shall
- 30 be held in that county seat closest to the affected waters, but if the area affected is
- 31 totally within State waters, the hearing shall be held in Annapolis.
- 32 (e) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, THE
- 33 DEPARTMENT MAY:
- 34 (I) DESIGNATE OYSTER SEED AREAS FOR AQUACULTURE
- 35 PURPOSES; AND
- 36 (II) DESIGNATE PORTIONS OF OYSTER SEED AREAS ESTABLISHED
- 37 UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE PRODUCTION OF SEED FOR USE
- 38 ON PRIVATE AQUACULTURE GROUNDS.
- 39 Except as provided in subsection (f) of this section, the State may sell
- 40 no more than [50] 10 percent of seed oysters in excess of one million bushels produced
- 41 annually in seed areas DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PUBLIC FISHERY
- 42 to citizens who hold valid leases under the provisions of this subtitle for no less than
- 43 the prevailing price of seed oysters of similar quality in nearby states. Conditions of
