BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 **Article - Natural Resources** 14 4-809. 15 A person may not catch or possess more than 10 hard crabs per bushel or 16 25 hard crabs per barrel which measure less than 5 inches across the shell from tip to 17 tip of spike. Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person may 18 19 not catch or possess peeler crabs measuring less than [3] THREE AND ONE-HALF 20 inches across the shell from tip to tip of spike. A person may possess a bycatch of peeler crabs measuring less than 21 22 [3] THREE AND ONE-HALF inches across the shell from tip to tip of spike if the 23 bycatch is not greater than: 24 (i) 30 per bushel; or

- 1 (3) In determining the number of peelers measuring less than [3]
- 2 THREE AND ONE-HALF inches across the shell from tip to tip of the spike, the
- 3 Department shall select the minimum number of bushels or floats necessary to be
- 4 representative of the person's catch.
- A person may not catch or possess soft crabs measuring less than three 6 and one-half inches across the shell from tip to tip of the spike.
- 7 In the waters of Worcester County, a person may not catch, possess, or
- 8 keep in floats any fat crabs, or any crab known as snot crab, green crab, or buckram
- 9 crab.
- The minimum size of crabs does not apply to mature female crabs, 10
- 11 identified by the rounded apron.
- 12 (f) The provisions of subsection (a) do not apply to crabs imported into
- 13 Maryland during the closed season for catching crabs if the person possessing the
- 14 imported crabs has a certificate of origin.
- 15 (g) Once taken, peelers shall be kept separate from other crabs.
- 16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 17 October 1, 2001.
