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## CHAPTER

## Natural Resources - Angler's License Requirements - Exemptions

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a provision of law that requires a certain certification
4 by the administrator of certain State-approved facilities as a condition for a 5 certain exemption for fishing in the waters of the State without an angler's 6 license; providing for an exemption from provisions of law requiring an angler's 7 license for certain persons under certain circumstances; making stylistic 8 changes; and generally relating to exemptions to provisions of law that require 9 an angler's license to fish in the waters of the State.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Natural Resources

18 4-604.
19 (a) This section provides a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing 20 game and freshwater fish and preventing unauthorized persons from fishing or
21 attempting to fish for any game and freshwater fish without first procuring an
22 angler's license.

1 (b) (1) In this section, "resident" means a person who resides in this State on 2 the date he applies for a license.

4 States who is on active duty and stationed officially in this State
(c) Any person 16 years old or older shall secure an angler's license to fish in 6 the nontidal waters of the State. An angler's license entitles the holder to fish in the 7 nontidal waters of the State only during the open season.
(d) An angler's license is not required of the following:
(1) The owner or tenant of land bordering on nontidal water, his spouse and children, or the spouse of any child who resides on the land with the owner or tenant when he fishes in nontidal water adjoining his land;
(2) Any convalescent patient of a veterans' hospital hospitalized for a service connected disability who fishes in nontidal waters if the patient secures a permit issued by a special service officer of the American Red Cross under authority granted by the Department;
(3) Any group of disabled or convalescent patients organized and under the care and supervision of the American Red Cross, which upon the request of the American Red Cross, is authorized by the Department to fish for any recreational purpose in the nontidal waters;
(4) Any resident serving in the armed forces of the United States, while on leave in the State, during his leave period, if, while angling, he possesses a copy of his official leave orders;
(5) Any patient who is under treatment by a State-approved mental health facility, and any individual who attends or resides in a State-approved retardation facility[, provided the administrator of the facility certifies that the patient or individual is engaged in an approved therapeutic program which would involve a fishing activity];
(6) A CAREGIVER, FAMILY MEMBER, OR DESIGNEE OF A MENTAL HEALTH CARE FACILITY OR PRIVATE GROUP HOME OF A PATIENT WHO IS UNDER TREATMENT BY A STATE-APPROVED MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY, PROVIDED THAT:
(I) THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE MENTAL HEALTH CARE FACILITY, OR TREATING PHYSICIAN OR PSYCHOLOGIST PROVIDES THE DEPARTMENT WITH A LETTER STATING THAT THE CAREGIVER OR FAMILY MEMBER IS THE PRIMARY CARETAKER OF THE PATIENT; OR
(\#) THE NURSE, NURSING ASSISTANT, PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, PSYCHOLOGIST, OR THE INDIVIDUAL WORKING UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE PSYCHOLOGIST PROVIDES A COPY OF HIS OR HER PROFESSIONAL LICENSE OR CERTIFICATION;
(7) A person who fishes in nontidal waters of the State on free fishing 6 days designated by the Secretary; or
(i) Resident $\$ 10$
(ii) Subject to paragraph (2)(ii) of this subsection, [short term]
(iii) Resident and nonresident blind persons. $\qquad$ .No fee
(iv) Complimentary license. $\qquad$ No fee
(i) The fee for an annual angler's license is the greater of:

1. $\$ 20$; or
2. A fee equal to the fee charged a Maryland resident by the nonresident's home state for a similar license; and

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2 3 nonresident's home state for a license that permits an equal number of days of fishing
4 or the next higher number of days as permitted by the Maryland license.
5 (3) (i) All fees collected by the Department under this section may 6 only be used in accordance with § 4-208 of this title.

7 (ii) The Department shall publicly report annually the amounts 8 collected and the expenditures under this section.

9 (h) A person designated to sell an angler's license shall issue the license and 10 collect the fee prescribed in subsection (g) of this section. The Department shall 11 furnish the licenses to the designated persons. An angler's license shall bear the 12 Secretary's facsimile signature and the counter-signature of the issuing person. The 13 person who issues the license shall fill out the name and address of the licensee on a 14 stub attached to the license blank and detach the stub. The stubs and money, collected
15 every month, shall be mailed to the Department on the first day of the succeeding 16 month. As compensation, the agent shall retain 50 cents for each license issued.

17 (i) Every angler's license shall expire on December 31 of each year following 18 the date of issuance.
(j) The licensee shall sign his name in ink on the license at the time of 20 purchase. The license may not be transferred to another person, nor used or
21 presented by any person other than the person to whom it was issued.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
23 October 1, 2001.
