Maryland Egg Law

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of the term "shell egg" to include certain

- 4 treated eggs; altering certain grade, quality, and labeling requirements;
- 5 establishing refrigeration requirements; authorizing the Secretary of
- 6 Agriculture to impose civil penalties; and generally relating to the regulation of
- 7 shell eggs under the Maryland Egg Law.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Agriculture

4 4-301.

5 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

6 (b) "Consumer" means any person who purchases or otherwise acquires shell 7 eggs for household consumption.

8 (c) "Packer" means any person who places shell eggs in the original case, 9 carton, or container that is used to hold eggs for distribution or sale to a consumer.

	10	(d)	(1)	"Distributor" means any person who:
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11 (i) Sells, offers, or exposes for sale shell eggs;

12 (ii) Purchases shell eggs for other than household consumption; or

13(iii)Distributes eggs to a retail outlet or food service facility owned14 by that person.

15 (2) "Distributor" does not include any person who purchases shell eggs 16 either exclusively as a retailer or exclusively for use in a food service facility or 17 exclusively both as a retailer and as a food service facility.

18 (e) "Food service facility" means any person who operates a facility where eggs 19 are used in the preparation of food and who does not distribute eggs to a food service 20 facility owned by that person.

(f) "Shell eggs" means raw OR TREATED CHICKEN eggs THAT ARE STILL IN
 THE SHELL AND INTENDED [produced by chickens] for human consumption.

(g) "Retailer" means any person who sells shell eggs to a consumer and whodoes not distribute eggs to a retail outlet owned by that person.

25 4-302.

No person may DONATE, sell, advertise, offer, or in any manner represent for sale shell eggs to any person unless the shell eggs meet standards of quality, grade, and size classification as provided in this subtitle.

29 4-303.

30 (a) The Secretary may adopt rules and regulations limiting the use of any 31 term used when shell eggs are offered or exposed for sale, sold, or advertised except

32 grade or size or weight classifications provided by statute.

(b) The term "fresh" [or the term "Maryland fresh", for shell eggs produced in
 the State,] may be used in addition to the applicable grade and size designation,
 except for shell eggs below A quality OR THOSE THAT HAVE BEEN TREATED BY A
 PROCESS THAT ALTERS SHELL EGGS. [The Secretary shall adopt rules and
 regulations setting the standards for "Maryland fresh" eggs.] Candling or any other
 method approved by the Secretary shall be used when making a final determination
 of whether shell eggs meet the standard of quality.

8 (C) TERMS APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY FOR SPECIAL GRADES OR
9 CONDITIONS OF PRODUCTION AND PROCESSING FOR SHELL EGGS MAY BE USED IN
10 ADDITION TO THE APPLICABLE GRADE AND SIZE DESIGNATION FOR SHELL EGGS
11 THAT COMPLY WITH REGULATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE SECRETARY FOR THESE
12 SPECIAL GRADES OR CONDITIONS.

13 (D) A PERSON MAY NOT DONATE, SELL, OFFER FOR SALE, OR DELIVER ANY
14 SHELL EGGS THAT ARE NOT LABELED ACCORDING TO REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY
15 THE SECRETARY.

16 4-304.

The size or weight classification for individual shell eggs in the State shall be the same as the official United States Department of Agriculture weight classes for shell eggs for the following classifications: jumbo, extra large, large, medium, small, and pee wee. The Secretary shall adopt rules and regulations prescribing the weights permitted in this subtitle. The net weight of shell eggs does not include the weight of any container.

The State standards for quality of individual or grades of shell eggs shall be the same as those of the United States Department of Agriculture.]

26 4-305.

27 (A) THE SECRETARY SHALL ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR QUALITY OF 28 INDIVIDUAL OR GRADES OF SHELL EGGS.

(B) UNLESS THE SHELL EGGS MEET THE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED BY THE
30 SECRETARY, A PERSON MAY NOT DONATE, SELL, ADVERTISE, OFFER, OR IN ANY
31 MANNER REPRESENT FOR SALE SHELL EGGS TO ANY CONSUMER.

32 4-305.1.

33 ALL SHELL EGGS SHALL BE STORED, DISPLAYED, AND TRANSPORTED IN A

34 REFRIGERATED AREA WHERE THE TEMPERATURE MEETS THE STANDARD

35 ESTABLISHED BY THE SECRETARY.

1 4-306.

2 (a) The Secretary may establish for use on a voluntary basis special grades of
3 shell eggs produced in the State that are of a standard superior to United States
4 Department of Agriculture Grade A shell eggs. The Secretary may adopt rules and
5 regulations:

6 (1) [prescribing] PRESCRIBING and defining quality and size standards, 7 and establishing special tolerances for the grade of shell eggs[,];

8 (2) REQUIRING SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF PRODUCTION AND 9 PROCESSING FOR SHELL EGGS[,];

10 (3) [requiring] REQUIRING, as a condition precedent to sale, any person 11 who desires to pack special grades for sale to register [annually] with the Secretary 12 and pay a reasonable [registration] fee set by the Secretary[,];

13 [(3)] (4) [devising] DEVISING and charging reasonable fees for seals or 14 other appropriate identifying insignia to be used, as a condition precedent to sale by 15 any person who desires to pack them for sale[,]; and

16 [(4)] (5) [adopting] ADOPTING other rules and regulations necessary to 17 effectuate the purposes of this section.

18 (b) In addition to any other penalty provided by this article, the Secretary may 19 revoke the registration of any person who violates any provision of this subtitle or any 20 rule or regulation adopted pursuant to it.

21 4-307.

No person may sell, offer to sell, or deliver any shell eggs not properly designated in respect to quality and size standard. When shell eggs are sold or offered for sale, the designation shall be plainly and conspicuously shown on the container and in the offer to sell, and if the shell eggs are loose, by a sign placed on or near the eggs. Any shell eggs not [designated as United States Department of Agriculture Grade B shall be presumed to be United States Department of Agriculture Grade A in allowing tolerance for quality] PROPERLY LABELED SHALL BE PRESUMED TO MEET THE GRADE A STANDARD FOR THE QUALITY OF SHELL EGGS.

30 4-308.

No person may sell or deliver shell eggs to a distributor, retailer, or food service facility unless at the time of delivery the person furnishes an invoice delivery ticket accurately detailing the sale of the shell eggs pursuant to this section. Every invoice delivery ticket shall contain upon its face the following information:

36 (2) Name and address of the seller;

1	(3)	Name and address of the purchaser;
2	(4)	The registration number, if any, of the purchaser;
3	(5)	The quantity;
4	(6)	The grade and size of the shell eggs delivered; and
5	(7)	The inspection fee, if applicable.

7 A person may not fail or refuse to make required reports or report falsely or with 8 intent to deceive.

9 4-310.

(a) During the usual business hours, the Secretary may enter any warehouse,
store, building, market, or any other place, carrier, conveyance, or vehicle where or
from where shell eggs are sold, offered, or exposed for sale, to enforce the provisions of
this subtitle.

(b) If the Secretary finds shell eggs are sold, offered or exposed for sale in
violation of the subtitle, he may issue a written or printed "stop-sale" order to the
person violating this section. After receipt of the order, the recipient may not sell,
offer, or expose for sale any shell eggs subject to the order. Any person upon whom a
"stop-sale" order has been served may appeal to the Secretary.

19 4-311.

If the Secretary finds that any shell eggs are adulterated or unfit for human consumption, he shall segregate them and mark them in a permanent manner to permit ready identification. If no appeal is taken from a determination of condemnation, the Secretary shall destroy them in a manner prescribed by the rules and regulations. If an appeal is taken, the condemned shell eggs shall be segregated and stored pending completion of an appeal inspection. The eggs may be destroyed in accordance with this section if the appeal is sustained.

27 4-311.1.

A person shall register with the Secretary each business location where that person is operating as either a packer or distributor.

30 4-311.2.

31 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, an applicant32 for registration shall:

33 (1) Submit to the Secretary an application on the form that the Secretary34 provides; and

1 (2) Pay to the Secretary the appropriate registration fee established in 2 subsection (c) of this section.

3 (b) A packer or distributor who keeps 3,000 or fewer chickens and who sells, 4 offers, or exposes for sale shell eggs only from those chickens shall register with the 5 Secretary, but is exempt from paying any fee required by this subtitle.

6 (c) The following persons shall pay to the Secretary the registration fee 7 indicated:

8	(1)	Packer\$30; and
9	(2)	Distributor\$30.

10 4-311.3.

11 (a) Unless a registration for a packer or distributor of shell eggs is renewed for 12 a 1-year term, the registration expires on January 1.

13 (b) Before a registration expires, the registration may be renewed for an 14 additional 1-year term, if the applicant:

15 (1) Is a packer or distributor of shell eggs;

16 (2) Pays the applicable fee as provided in § 4-311.2 of this subtitle; and

17 (3) Submits to the Secretary a renewal application on a form that the18 Secretary provides.

19 (c) The packer or distributor shall display the registration conspicuously at 20 each place of business.

21 (d) The packer or distributor shall notify the Secretary if the packer's or22 distributor's business is moved to a new location.

23 4-311.4.

24 Subject to the hearing provisions adopted by the Secretary, the Secretary may 25 deny, suspend, or revoke the registration for a packer or distributor if:

26 (1) The packer or distributor does not meet the requirements of this title; 27 or

(2) The packer or distributor violates any provision of this subtitle or any29 regulation adopted by the Secretary.

6 This subtitle may be cited as the Maryland Egg Law.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect8 October 1, 2001.
