- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that real property that is the principal family residence
- of a husband and wife, held by them as tenants by the entireties, and conveyed
- 5 to certain trusts is not subject to claims by their separate creditors under certain
- 6 circumstances; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to
- 7 protection of certain principal family residences held in certain trusts from the
- 8 separate claims of creditors.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Real Property

- 18 REAL PROPERTY THAT IS THE PRINCIPAL FAMILY RESIDENCE OF A HUSBAND
- 19 AND WIFE, HELD BY THEM AS TENANTS BY THE ENTIRETIES, AND CONVEYED TO
- 20 THEIR JOINT REVOCABLE TRUST, OR IN EQUAL SHARES TO THEIR SEPARATE
- 21 REVOCABLE TRUSTS, IS NOT SUBJECT TO A CLAIM BY THEIR SEPARATE CREDITORS
- 22 TO THE SAME EXTENT AS IF IT REMAINED A TENANCY BY THE ENTIRETIES AS LONG 23 AS:
- 24 (1) THE HUSBAND AND WIFE REMAIN MARRIED TO EACH OTHER;
- 25 (2) THE REAL PROPERTY CONTINUES TO BE HELD IN THE TRUST OR
- 26 TRUSTS; AND
- 27 (3) THE REAL PROPERTY CONTINUES TO BE THE PRINCIPAL FAMILY 28 RESIDENCE OF THE HUSBAND AND WIFE.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all real property transfers executed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 2001.
