# Tri-County Council for the Lower Eastern Shore of Maryland

3 FOR the purpose of adding a new article to the Annotated Code of Maryland to be

4 designated and known as the "Tri-County Council for the Lower Eastern Shore

5 of Maryland"; establishing the Council as <del>an association of local governments</del>

6 from a regional planning and development agency for Somerset, Wicomico, and

Worcester counties to facilitate regional planning and development in the regionwhere the counties are located; providing for the function and dissolution of the

8 where the counties are located; providing for the function and dissolution of the 9 Council; providing for the membership of the Council; providing for the terms of

10 the members of the Council; prohibiting a member of the Council from receiving

11 compensation; <u>specifying that membership on the Council does not constitute an</u>

12 office of profit; *authorizing the Council to employ a council executive director*;

13 providing for legal representation of the Council; providing for the powers and

14 functions of the Council; requiring the members of the Council to elect a

15 chairperson from among the members of the Council; authorizing the Council to

16 adopt bylaws, rules, and regulations; providing funding for the Council from the

17 State budget and the local governments representing the Council; defining

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- 1 certain terms; making this Act an emergency measure; <u>providing for the</u>
- 2 construction of this Act; and generally relating to the Tri-County Council of the

31 (B) THE TRI-COUNTY REGION CONSISTS OF ALL OF SOMERSET, WICOMICO, 32 AND WORCESTER COUNTIES.

2 (A) (1) THE COUNCIL IS A TAX-EXEMPT PUBLIC BODY CORPORATE AND
3 POLITIC WHICH OPERATES AS A COOPERATIVE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT
4 AGENCY IN THE REGION TO FOSTER THE PHYSICAL, ECONOMIC, AND SOCIAL
5 DEVELOPMENT OF THE REGION AND UTILIZES EFFECTIVELY THE ASSISTANCE
6 PROVIDED BY THE STATE.

7 (2) THE COUNCIL INITIATES AND COORDINATES PLANS AND PROJECTS
8 FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF HUMAN AND ECONOMIC RESOURCES OF THE LOWER

 COUNCIL IS LOCATED, EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE COUNCIL OR TO AN
 ORGANIZATION, THAT THE COURT DETERMINES, WHICH ARE ORGANIZED AND
 OPERATED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE COUNCIL THE INDIVIDUAL
 COUNTIES.

7 (3) THE STATE BUDGET, SUBJECT TO ANNUAL REVIEW BY THE GENERAL
8 ASSEMBLY, SHALL PROVIDE AN APPROPRIATION OF AT LEAST \$200,000 IN THE
9 FOLLOWING FISCAL YEAR FOR PARTIAL SUPPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

10 (B) (1) THE COUNCIL AND THE COUNCIL'S ACTIVITIES MAY BE FINANCED 11 COOPERATIVELY BY THE STATE OF MARYLAND AND SOMERSET, WICOMICO, AND 12 WORCESTER COUNTIES.

13 (2) THE COUNCIL MAY RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM OTHER 14 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SOURCES.

(3) THE GOVERNING BODIES OF SOMERSET, WICOMICO, AND
 WORCESTER COUNTIES ANNUALLY SHALL APPROPRIATE AT LEAST \$10,000 EACH FOR
 THE USE OF THE COUNCIL TO FOSTER COOPERATIVE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT
 IN THE REGION.

(4) OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS OR SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS
 MAY APPROPRIATE MONEY THAT IS NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE FOR THE
 COUNCIL.

<u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be</u>
 <u>construed to confer any land use regulation or zoning authority to the Tri-County</u>
 Council for the Lower Eastern Shore of Maryland.

25 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an

26 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health

27 and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the

28 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take

29 effect from the date it is enacted.

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
