- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 22 (7) "Full-time equivalent enrollment" means:
- 23 (i) All students enrolled in [grades 1] KINDERGARTEN through
- 24 GRADE 12 or their equivalent in regular day school programs on September 30 of the
- 25 previous school year; AND

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	(ii) [One half of the number of students enrolled in kindergarten programs on September 30 of the previous school year, except that in Garrett County the full number of kindergarten students is included; and
	(iii)] The number of full-time equivalent students, as determined by a regulation of the Department, enrolled in evening high school programs during the previous school year.

8 9	(a) All individuals who are 5 years old or older and under 21 shall be admitted free of charge to the public schools of this State.
	(b) (1) Except as provided in § 7-301 of this title and in paragraph (2) of this subsection, each child shall attend a public school in the county where the child is domiciled with the child's parent or guardian.
15	(2) Upon request and in accordance with a county board's policies concerning residency, a county superintendent may allow a child to attend school in the county even if the child is not domiciled in that county with the child's parent or guardian.
19	(3) If a child fraudulently attends a public school in a county where the child is not domiciled with the child's parent or guardian, the child's parent or guardian shall be subject to a penalty payable to the county for the pro rata share of tuition for the time the child fraudulently attends a public school in the county.
	(4) Nothing in this section alters the requirements for out-of-county placements contained in § 4-122 and Title 8, Subtitles 3 and 4 of this article or in any other State or federal law.
24	(c) [There shall be full kindergarten programs in each county of this State.]
25 26	(1) BY THE 2006-2007 SCHOOL YEAR, THE COUNTY BOARDS SHALL ESTABLISH FULL DAY KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS IN EACH COUNTY OF THIS STATE.
27 28	(2) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO PHASE IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBSECTION BY THE 2006-2007 SCHOOL YEAR.
29 30	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
