CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Anne Arundel County - Orphans' Court Judges - Salary Increase**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing to a certain amount the salaries of the judges of the  
4 Orphans' Court of Anne Arundel County; and providing that this Act does not  
5 apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent judges of the Orphans'  
6 Court of Anne Arundel County.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
8 Article - Estates and Trusts  
9 Section 2-108(c)  
10 Annotated Code of Maryland  
11 (1991 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Estates and Trusts**

15 2-108.

16 (c) Each of the judges of the Court for Anne Arundel County shall receive an  
17 annual compensation of [\$15,000] \$19,000, and the Chief Judge shall receive an  
18 additional \$500 annually. Each judge shall also receive an expense allowance up to  
19 \$150 per month for personal expenses incidental to his duties, to be paid by the  
20 Comptroller of Anne Arundel County each month upon presentation of an itemized  
21 voucher in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the Comptroller.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III,  
2 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or  
3 apply to the salary or compensation of the judges of the Orphans' Court of Anne  
4 Arundel County in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act  
5 concerning the salary or compensation of the judges of the Orphans' Court of Anne  
6 Arundel County shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
8 October 1, 2001.
