18 19	(A) IN THIS SECTION, "EXPLOITATION" MEANS ANY ACTION WHICH INVOLVES THE MISUSE OF THE FUNDS, PROPERTY, OR PERSON OF A VULNERABLE ADULT, AS DEFINED IN § 14-101(Q) OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE, OR AN ADULT WHO IS UNABLE TO LIVE INDEPENDENTLY, AS DEFINED IN § 7-101(K)(1) OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE.
23 24 25 26 27 28 29	(B) If any executor, administrator, guardian, committee, trustee, receiver or any fiduciary shall ENGAGE IN EXPLOITATION CONTRARY TO THE TRUST OF THE FIDUCIARY OR fraudulently and wilfully appropriate to any use and purpose not in the due and lawful execution of [his] THE PERSON'S trust, any money or any other thing of value which may come into [his] THE PERSON'S hands as such executor, administrator, guardian, committee, trustee, receiver, or in any other fiduciary capacity, or secrete it with a fraudulent intent to appropriate it to such use or purpose, [he] THE PERSON shall be deemed guilty of embezzlement, and shall be punished upon conviction by imprisonment in the penitentiary for not less than one year nor more than five years.
33 34 35	(C) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, A PERSON WHO HAS OR EXERCISES CONTROL OR AUTHORITY OVER THE FINANCIAL ASSETS OF A VULNERABLE ADULT, AS DEFINED IN § 14-101(Q) OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE, OR AN ADULT WHO IS UNABLE TO LIVE INDEPENDENTLY, AS DEFINED IN § 7-101(K)(1) OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE, IS PRESUMED TO HAVE A FIDUCIARY RELATIONSHIP WITH THE VULNERABLE ADULT OR THE ADULT WHO IS UNABLE TO LIVE INDEPENDENTLY.
