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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Maryland School Performance Assessment Program - Study Commission

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission to evaluate and recommend changes
- 4 to the Maryland School Performance Assessment Program; providing for the
- 5 membership, chairman, duties, and staffing of the Commission; requiring the
- 6 Commission to report to the Governor and to the General Assembly by a certain
- 7 date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the
- 8 establishment of a Commission to Study the Maryland School Performance
- 9 Assessment Program.
- 10 BY adding to
- 11 Article Education
- 12 Section 5-208.1
- 13 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 14 (1999 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)
- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 17 Article Education

18 5-208.1.

- 19 (A) THERE IS A COMMISSION TO STUDY THE MARYLAND SCHOOL
- 20 PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM.
- 21 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL BE COMPOSED OF THE FOLLOWING 15
- 22 MEMBERS:
- 23 (1) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY THE
- 24 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE:
- 25 (2) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE
- 26 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;

- 1 (3) THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OR 2 THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S DESIGNEE;
- 3 (4) THE FOLLOWING 12 MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:
- 4 (I) THE DEAN OF AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OF EDUCATION
- 5 WITHIN THE STATE;
- 6 (II) ONE MEMBER FROM THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY;
- 7 (III) ONE PRINCIPAL SERVING IN A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY OR 8 MIDDLE SCHOOL WITHIN THE STATE;
- 9 (IV) SEVEN REPRESENTATIVES, GEOGRAPHICALLY BALANCED,
- 10 FROM THE ORGANIZATION SERVING AS THE EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE OF
- 11 TEACHERS IN EIGHT DIFFERENT SCHOOL SYSTEMS, ONE OF WHICH SHALL BE
- 12 BALTIMORE CITY;
- 13 (V) ONE PARENT SELECTED FROM A LIST SUBMITTED BY THE
- 14 MARYLAND PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION; AND
- 15 (VI) ONE MEMBER OF THE PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS AND
- 16 TEACHER EDUCATION BOARD.
- 17 (C) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE ONE OF THE MEMBERS AS CHAIRMAN 18 OF THE COMMISSION.
- 19 (D) THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES SHALL PROVIDE STAFF 20 SUPPORT FOR THE COMMISSION.
- 21 (E) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR
- 22 SERVING ON THE COMMISSION, BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR
- 23 EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN
- 24 THE STATE BUDGET.
- 25 (F) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- 26 (1) CREATE AND ADMINISTER A SURVEY TO BE DISTRIBUTED
- 27 STATEWIDE TO SCHOOL PERSONNEL FOR GRADES KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 8 WHO
- 28 ADMINISTER THE MARYLAND SCHOOL PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM; AND
- 29 (2) EVALUATE THE RESULTS OF THE SURVEY AND, ON THE BASIS OF
- 30 THOSE RESULTS, RECOMMEND MODIFICATIONS AND CHANGES TO THE STATE
- 31 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION WITH RESPECT TO THE MARYLAND SCHOOL
- 32 PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM.
- 33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Commission shall
- 34 report to the Governor, and in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government
- 35 Article, to the General Assembly on or before December 1, 2001 and on or before
- 36 December 1, 2002.

- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 1
- 2 July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 18 months and, at the end of 3 December 31, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 4 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
