CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Carroll County - Special Deputy Sheriffs**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Sheriff of Carroll County to appoint special
4 deputy sheriffs who are members of the police force of a municipal corporation in
5 Carroll County; setting forth the conditions to which the appointment of a
6 special deputy sheriff in Carroll County is subject; and generally relating to
7 special deputy sheriffs in Carroll County.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

2 2-309.

3 (h) (1) The Sheriff of Carroll County shall receive a salary of \$45,000 a year.
4 The Sheriff may employ the number of personnel necessary for the proper execution
5 of the duties of office. Personnel shall receive the compensation set by the County
6 Commissioners.

7 (2) Personnel employed pursuant to this section shall be placed on a
8 probationary status for the first 18 months of employment, and may be dismissed by
9 the Sheriff for any reason. After 18 months of continuous employment, personnel may
10 only be disciplined or dismissed for just cause:

11 (i) In accordance with the Law-Enforcement Officers' Bill of
12 Rights, if the employee's rights are covered under this bill of rights; or

13 (ii) In accordance with the personnel rules and regulations of the
14 Carroll County Sheriff's office, if the employee's rights are not covered under the
15 Law-Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights.

16 (3) Except for an appeal taken pursuant to the Law-Enforcement
17 Officers' Bill of Rights, an appeal by an aggrieved party shall be taken to the Circuit
18 Court for Carroll County.

19 (4) The Sheriff may also appoint a chief deputy and a warden who shall
20 serve at the pleasure of the Sheriff.

21 (5) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE
22 SHERIFF OF CARROLL COUNTY MAY APPOINT SPECIAL DEPUTY SHERIFFS WHO ARE:

23 1. MEMBERS OF THE POLICE FORCE OF A CARROLL COUNTY
24 MUNICIPAL CORPORATION;

25 2. SELECTED BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE MUNICIPAL
26 CORPORATION; AND

27 3. VERIFIED BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE MUNICIPAL
28 CORPORATION AS HAVING ACHIEVED AT LEAST THE MINIMUM LEVEL OF TRAINING
29 FOR POLICE DUTIES IN A MUNICIPALITY AS DESIGNATED BY THE MARYLAND POLICE
30 TRAINING COMMISSION.

31 (II) THE APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL DEPUTY SHERIFFS UNDER
32 SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING
33 CONDITIONS:

34 1. THE SHERIFF MAY ASSIGN THE DUTIES OF SPECIAL
35 DEPUTIES;
