(1) 4 The Sheriff may employ the number of personnel necessary for the proper execution 5 of the duties of office. Personnel shall receive the compensation set by the County 6 Commissioners. 7 Personnel employed pursuant to this section shall be placed on a (2) 8 probationary status for the first 18 months of employment, and may be dismissed by 9 the Sheriff for any reason.
