AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Veterans' Commission and the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs shall conduct a study of the feasibility of establishing a veterans' cemetery on the grounds of the former Bainbridge Naval Training Center in Cecil County. On or before November 30, 2001, the Commission and the Department shall report the results of the study, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the appropriate committees of the General Assembly and the members of the Cecil County legislative delegation.
