- WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly that the current shortage in
- 16 nurses, expected to worsen because of the declines in nursing school enrollments and
- 17 the significant number of nurses expected to retire over the next decade, will require
- 18 an increase in the number of nurses necessary to provide direct patient care; and
- WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly that encouraging initiatives
- 20 to provide affordable housing for nurses as part of the State's efforts to recruit and
- 21 retain qualified nurses will help meet the State's critical need for nurses in certain
- 22 areas; and
- WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly to encourage
- 24 homeownership opportunities for nurses in priority funding areas that meet the
- 25 requirements of Title 5, Subtitle 7B of the State Finance and Procurement Article of

32 33 34 35 36	It is further found and declared that the public infrastructure maintained by local government, which includes streets, sidewalks, curbs, sewer and water systems, bridges, and public buildings, is in need of rehabilitation and construction, that the resources necessary for financing infrastructure projects have become scarcer in recent years, and that providing an additional, accessible, and uncomplicated mechanism for financing infrastructure needs promotes sound community development, is vital to a strong economy, improves the quality of the environment, and otherwise promotes the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the State.					

- It is further found and declared that to promote sound community development is a proper public purpose and State use for which public money may be expended and property may be acquired, and that the functions and responsibilities of the
- 4 Community Development Administration as hereinafter set forth are necessary and
- 5 proper for the purpose of achieving the ends here recited.
