	WHEREAS, Deaths from errors in the prescription and administration of medications may claim as many as 7,000 lives annually, exceeding the number of deaths attributed annually to workplace injuries; and

1	WHEREAS, Medically induced injuries and death not only represent a major
2	2 public health problem resulting not only in death, permanent disability, and

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1,
- 7 2001 January 1, 2002, the Maryland Health Care Commission shall report issue a
- 8 preliminary report and, on or before January 1, 2003, issue a final report to the
- 9 Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the House
- 10 Economic Matters and House Environmental Matters committees, and the Senate
- 11 Finance Committee on the Commission's recommendations for implementing the
- 12 provisions of this Act by legislation or regulation as a result of the study required by
- 13 this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 July 1, 2001.
