## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Baltimore City - Orphans' Court Judges - Pensions

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the calculation of the pensions for the associate judges
- 4 and the Chief Judge of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; altering the
- 5 maximum pensions that may be paid; providing for the construction of this Act;
- and generally relating to pensions for the associate judges and the Chief Judge
- 7 of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City.
- 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 9 Article Estates and Trusts
- 10 Section 2-108(d)
- 11 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 12 (1991 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (d) (1) Each associate judge of the Court of Baltimore City shall receive
- 18 an annual compensation of \$50,000, and the Chief Judge shall receive an annual
- 19 compensation of \$60,000.
- 20 (ii) Each associate judge who was in active service on or after
- 21 January 1, 1981 shall be paid after the termination of active service, if he is then at
- 22 least 60 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary
- 23 calculated at the rate of \$1,500 annually for each year, or a part of a year, of active
- 24 service ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1984 AND \$2,500 ANNUALLY FOR EACH YEAR, OR
- 25 PART OF A YEAR, OF ACTIVE SERVICE ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984; but the
- 26 maximum pension or salary for the service by an associate judge may not exceed
- 27 [\$15,000] \$25,000 annually.

- 1 (III) Each Chief Judge who was in active service on or after January
- 2 1, 1981, shall be paid, after the termination of active service, if he is then at least 60
- 3 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary calculated at
- 4 the rate of \$1,525 annually for each year, or a part of a year of active service[,] ON OR
- 5 BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1984 AND \$3,000 ANNUALLY FOR EACH YEAR, OR PART OF A
- 6 YEAR, OF ACTIVE SERVICE ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984; but the maximum pension
- 7 or salary for the service by a Chief Judge may not exceed [\$15,250] \$30,000 annually.
- 8 The pension or salary shall be paid by the City of Baltimore in the same manner as
- 9 the salaries of the judges of the Court for the City are paid.
- 10 (2) The surviving spouse of every elected judge of the Court of Baltimore
- 11 City shall be paid one half of the pension to which his spouse was entitled at the time
- 12 of his death, or would have become entitled to by reason of attaining 60 years of age.
- 13 In each instance, the pension shall be paid to the spouse until remarriage or death.
- 14 The provisions of this subsection shall not apply in the case of a spouse who was
- 15 married to a sitting judge for a period of less than three years prior to his death, and
- 16 to a retired judge for a period less than three years before his retirement.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 18 construed only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect
- 19 on or application to any pension payable to an associate judge or the Chief Judge of
- 20 the Orphans' Court of Baltimore City before the effective date of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 July 1, 2001.
