



- 24 Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid for any
- 25 reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other
- 26 provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the
- 27 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are
- 28 declared severable.
- 29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the members of the
- 30 Canal Place Preservation and Development Authority appointed by the Governor
- 31 under this Act shall serve terms staggered such that no more than two appointments
- 32 expire each year.
- 33 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That notwithstanding any
- 34 other provision of this Act, the members of the Authority whose terms have not
- 35 expired as of July 1, 2001, shall continue as members of the Authority until their then
- 36 current terms expire.
- 37 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 38 July 1, 2001.
