BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 **Article - Transportation** 4 11-154.1. 5 "SCOOTER" MEANS A TWO-WHEELED VEHICLE THAT: 6 (1) HAS HANDLEBARS; AND 7 IS DESIGNED TO BE STOOD ON BY THE OPERATOR; AND (2) 8 (3)(I)IS POWERED BY A MOTOR; OR 9 (H)IS NOT MOTORIZED. 10 16 104.3. 21-1207.2. AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 16 YEARS MAY NOT RIDE ON A 11 (A) (1)12 SCOOTER OR ON IN-LINE SKATES ON ANY HIGHWAY, ANY BICYCLE WAY, SIDEWALK, 13 OR OTHER PROPERTY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC OR USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR 14 PEDESTRIAN OR VEHICULAR TRAFFIC IN THE STATE UNLESS THE INDIVIDUAL 15 WEARS IS WEARING A HELMET OR PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR THAT MEETS OR 16 EXCEEDS THE STANDARDS FOR PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR FOR SCOOTER USE 17 ADOPTED BY THE AMERICAN NATIONAL STANDARDS INSTITUTE, THE SNELL 18 MEMORIAL FOUNDATION, OR THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF TESTING AND 19 **MEASUREMENTS**. 20 (2)IF THE STANDARDS SETTING ORGANIZATIONS LISTED IN 21 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT HAVE STANDARDS FOR PROTECTIVE 22 HEADGEAR FOR SCOOTER USE, AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 16 YEARS SHALL 23 WEAR A HELMET OR PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR THAT MEETS OR EXCEEDS THE 24 STANDARDS ADOPTED BY OF THOSE ORGANIZATIONS THE AMERICAN NATIONAL 25 STANDARDS INSTITUTE, THE SNELL MEMORIAL FOUNDATION, OR THE AMERICAN 26 SOCIETY OF TESTING AND MEASUREMENTS FOR PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR FOR 27 BICYCLISTS USE IN BICYCLING OR IN-LINE SKATING. THIS SECTION SHALL BE ENFORCED BY THE ISSUANCE OF A WARNING 28 (B) 29 THAT INFORMS THE OFFENDER OF THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AND 30 PROVIDES EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS ABOUT HELMET USE. 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That the Motor Vehicle 32 Administration shall study the safety of operating motorized and nonmotorized
- 33 scooters and the feasibility and desirability of further regulating their operation
- 34 beyond the requirement imposed under this Act. The Motor Vehicle Administration
- 35 shall report its findings to the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee and the House
- 36 Commerce and Government Matters Committee of the General Assembly, subject to §
- 37 2 1246 of the State Government Article, on or before December 31, 2001.

- SECTION 3- $\underline{2}$. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 2 effect October 1, 2001.
