HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

United States Food and Drug Administration - Labeling Laws and Policies Relating to Allergenic Ingredients in Food

4 FOR the purpose of requesting the United States Food and Drug Administration

- 5 (FDA) to create a symbol for display on food packages to indicate that certain
- 6 allergenic ingredients are contained in certain packaged food; requesting the
- 7 FDA to establish a toll-free line which will provide certain information;

8 requesting the FDA to develop certain rules and guidelines for labeling food

9 products that contain allergenic ingredients; requesting the FDA to prohibit the

10 use of certain generic terms; requesting the FDA to establish a list of standard

11 names for certain products; and generally relating to labeling laws and policies

12 for allergenic ingredients in food.

WHEREAS, Approximately 6 million Americans (or 2% of the population) sufferfrom food allergies; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 125 deaths per year result from fatal allergicreactions to food; and

17 WHEREAS, Eating foods that contain even trace amounts of allergenic

18 ingredients can lead to symptoms that range from a tingling sensation in the mouth,

19 swelling of the tongue and the throat, difficulty breathing, hives, vomiting, abdominal

20 cramps, diarrhea, drop in blood pressure, loss of consciousness, to death; and

21 WHEREAS, The best way for individuals to manage food allergies is to strictly 22 avoid foods or food additives to which they are allergic; and

23 WHEREAS, It is important for individuals with food allergies to be able to 24 identify ingredients in the food they eat; and

WHEREAS, Labeling is an appropriate way to enable "hyperreactive"
individuals to avoid exposure to allergenic ingredients that could trigger an allergic
reaction; and

1 WHEREAS, Individuals with food allergies find it extremely difficult to

2 determine whether everyday foods are safe for them or their family members to eat;3 and

4 WHEREAS, Current labeling laws and regulations make it very difficult to find 5 safe food; and

6 WHEREAS, Composite food products that are the result of several producers 7 result in hidden allergenic ingredients that can cause serious reactions; and

8 WHEREAS, The prevalence and seriousness of food allergies are well-known 9 and documented; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the United
 States Food and Drug Administration is requested to create a symbol that will be
 prominently displayed on food packages to alert consumers that the product contains
 allergenic ingredients; and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to establish a toll-free hot line where 15 consumers can obtain reliable food ingredient information, and be it further

16 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to require that food labels specify that 17 an allergenic ingredient, even in insignificant levels, has been used in a product; and 18 be it further

19 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to prohibit the use of generic terms such 20 as "flavoring" and specifically require food processors and manufacturers to specify 21 every ingredient included in generic terms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to develop industry guidelines to identify and prevent the migration of allergenic ingredients from one product to another during processing and preparation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to require the use of standard product names to prevent the same product being called several different names; and be it further
