HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 **United States Food and Drug Administration - Labeling Laws and Policies**  
3 **Relating to Allergenic Ingredients in Food**

4 FOR the purpose of requesting the United States Food and Drug Administration  
5 (FDA) to create a symbol for display on food packages to indicate that certain  
6 allergenic ingredients are contained in certain packaged food; requesting the  
7 FDA to establish a toll-free line which will provide certain information;  
8 requesting the FDA to develop certain rules and guidelines for labeling food  
9 products that contain allergenic ingredients; requesting the FDA to prohibit the  
10 use of certain generic terms; requesting the FDA to establish a list of standard  
11 names for certain products; and generally relating to labeling laws and policies  
12 for allergenic ingredients in food.

13 WHEREAS, Approximately 6 million Americans (or 2% of the population) suffer  
14 from food allergies; and

15 WHEREAS, An estimated 125 deaths per year result from fatal allergic  
16 reactions to food; and

17 WHEREAS, Eating foods that contain even trace amounts of allergenic  
18 ingredients can lead to symptoms that range from a tingling sensation in the mouth,  
19 swelling of the tongue and the throat, difficulty breathing, hives, vomiting, abdominal  
20 cramps, diarrhea, drop in blood pressure, loss of consciousness, to death; and

21 WHEREAS, The best way for individuals to manage food allergies is to strictly  
22 avoid foods or food additives to which they are allergic; and

23 WHEREAS, It is important for individuals with food allergies to be able to  
24 identify ingredients in the food they eat; and

1 WHEREAS, Labeling is an appropriate way to enable "hyperreactive"  
2 individuals to avoid exposure to allergenic ingredients that could trigger an allergic  
3 reaction; and

4 WHEREAS, Individuals with food allergies find it extremely difficult to  
5 determine whether everyday foods are safe for them or their family members to eat;  
6 and

7 WHEREAS, Current labeling laws and regulations make it very difficult to find  
8 safe food; and

9 WHEREAS, Composite food products that are the result of several producers  
10 result in hidden allergenic ingredients that can cause serious reactions; and

11 WHEREAS, The prevalence and seriousness of food allergies are well-known  
12 and documented; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the United  
14 States Food and Drug Administration is requested to create a symbol that will be  
15 prominently displayed on food packages to alert consumers that the product contains  
16 allergenic ingredients; and be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to establish a toll-free hot line where  
18 consumers can obtain reliable food ingredient information, and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to require that food labels specify that  
20 an allergenic ingredient, even in insignificant levels, has been used in a product; and  
21 be it further

22 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to prohibit the use of generic terms such  
23 as "flavoring" and specifically require food processors and manufacturers to specify  
24 every ingredient included in generic terms; and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to develop industry guidelines to  
26 identify and prevent the migration of allergenic ingredients from one product to  
27 another during processing and preparation; and be it further

28 RESOLVED, That the FDA is requested to require the use of standard product  
29 names to prevent the same product being called several different names; and be it  
30 further
