HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2

Center for Excellence for Autism in Maryland

3 FOR the purpose of urging the University of Maryland, the University of Maryland

4 Medical Center, The Johns Hopkins University, The Johns Hopkins Hospital,

5 and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to investigate the feasibility

6 of working collaboratively in the field of autism research with the objective of

7 establishing joint research and clinical programs that could compete for

8 National Institutes of Health funding as a Center for Excellence for Autism in

9 Maryland; and generally relating to the establishment of a Center for Excellence

10 for Autism in Maryland.

11 WHEREAS, Best estimates indicate that one in 500 children born in the State 12 will be diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder, a disorder that causes severe

13 impairments in language and communication; and

14 WHEREAS, There is evidence that the incidence of autism in Maryland is on the 15 rise; and

WHEREAS, The Children's Health Act of 2000 authorizes the National
Institutes of Health to provide up to \$40,000,000 over a 5-year period to public or

18 nonprofit private entities to establish centers of excellence in autism and pervasive

19 developmental disabilities epidemiology for the purpose of collecting and analyzing

20 information on the number, incidence, correlates, and causes of autism and related

21 developmental disabilities and basic and clinical research into autism, including

22 investigations into the cause, diagnosis, early detection, prevention, control, and

23 treatment of autism; and

WHEREAS, Centers of excellence under the Children's Health Act of 2000 may use the facilities of a single institution, or may be formed from a consortium of cooperating institutions; and

27 WHEREAS, The diverse symptoms and etiology of autism require a high level of

28 activity in the widest variety of scientific fields, from genetics and neurology to

29 neuroimaging, immunology, and gastroenterology, if effective treatments and a cure

30 are to be found quickly; and

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 16

1 WHEREAS, The University of Maryland, the University of Maryland Medical

2 Center, The Johns Hopkins University, and The Johns Hopkins Hospital are top tier

3 research and medical institutions in Maryland which are already actively involved in

4 different aspects of autism research and treatment; now, therefore, be it

5 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the

6 University of Maryland, the University of Maryland Medical Center, The Johns

7 Hopkins University, and The Johns Hopkins University Hospital work in consultation

8 with one another and with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to

9 determine the feasibility of establishing a consortium in the field of autism for the 10 purpose of:

(1) collecting and analyzing information on the number, incidence,12 correlates, and causes of autism and related developmental disabilities; and

13 (2) performing basic and clinical research into autism, including 14 investigations into the cause, diagnosis, early detection, prevention, control, and 15 treatment of autism; and be it further

16 RESOLVED, That, if it is determined by these entities that a consortium in one

 $17\;$ or both of the research areas discussed is feasible and desirable, that the General

18 Assembly and the Office of the Governor will provide support as appropriate and

19 necessary to facilitate the designation of the consortium as a Center for Excellence in

20 Autism, as that term is defined by the National Institutes of Health; and be it further

21 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of

22 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;

23 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and 24 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
