## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

## Dumping of Dredge Spoil - Prohibition

- 3 FOR the purpose of recognizing the significant environmental concerns with dredging
- 4 the Bay; recognizing the significant environmental concerns associated with
- 5 placement of dredge material; and urging that certain dumping of dredge
- 6 material be prohibited except under certain circumstances.
- WHEREAS, The shipping industry is a major component of Maryland's
- 8 infrastructure, essential to the continuing economic well-being of the State; and
- 9 WHEREAS, There are both immediate and long-term needs for maintaining
- 10 and expanding the draft and capacity of shipping lanes in the waters of the State,
- 11 including the channel approaches to the Port of Baltimore, the main stem of the
- 12 Chesapeake Bay, and the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal; and
- WHEREAS, The most pressing issue in the maintenance of the approach
- 14 channels to the Port of Baltimore is the availability of adequate capacity for dredge
- 15 material in maintenance operations; and
- WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has a long-standing tradition of protecting
- 17 and restoring the Chesapeake Bay; and
- WHEREAS, The goal of restoring the Chesapeake Bay as the largest and most
- 19 productive estuary in the United States should include plans that recognize the
- 20 historical location of existing and historical natural islands; and
- 21 WHEREAS, There exist several sites in the Chesapeake Bay that would readily
- 22 support the beneficial uses of clean dredge material for the restoration of wetlands
- 23 and the restoration of existing and historical natural islands and habitat; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The House of Delegates passed legislation during the 2000
- 25 legislative session to prohibit a person from dumping dredge material in certain areas
- 26 of the Chesapeake Bay or onto an area known as Site 104; and
- WHEREAS, The dredge material is recognized as a natural mineral resource
- 28 with the potential for economic value; and

- WHEREAS, Governor Parris N. Glendening terminated consideration of Site
- 2 104 as an open bay dumping area for 5,000 barge loads of spoil; now, therefore, be it
- 3 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 4 General Assembly recognizes there are significant environmental concerns with open
- 5 water dumping of dredge material and there is a critical need to develop alternative
- 6 beneficial uses for dredge material; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly recognizes there are significant
- 8 environmental concerns including nutrient releases and bay eutrophication,
- 9 associated with placement of dredge material in the deep trough of the Chesapeake
- 10 Bay; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly urges that open water dumping of
- 12 dredge material into the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries should be prohibited
- 13 unless the dredge material will be used to restore natural islands or wetlands,
- 14 including Poole's Island; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 16 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
