2 **Drivers' Licenses - Graduated Licensing System - Provisional Licenses -**  
3 **~~Occupant Restrictions Applicable to Minors~~ Restrictions**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to impose on  
5 provisional drivers' licenses issued to individuals under a certain age certain  
6 restrictions pertaining to ~~occupants of a motor vehicle; extending certain~~  
7 ~~sanctions to violations of certain license restrictions resulting in convictions~~ seat  
8 belt and child safety seat use; limiting the application of this Act to certain  
9 drivers who hold provisional licenses as of a specified date; and generally  
10 relating to license restrictions applicable to drivers who are under a certain age  
11 and who hold provisional drivers' licenses.

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 **Article - Transportation**

8 16-113.

9 (d) (1) Notwithstanding the licensee's driving record, the Administration  
 10 shall impose an hour restriction on a provisional driver's license issued to an  
 11 applicant under the age of 18.

12 (2) The restriction under this subsection shall limit the holder of a  
 13 provisional license to driving unsupervised only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 12  
 14 midnight.

15 (3) This subsection does not preclude the holder of a provisional license  
 16 from driving between the hours of 12 midnight and 5 a.m. the following day if the  
 17 licensee is:

18 (i) Accompanied and supervised by a licensed driver who is at least  
 19 21 years old;

20 (ii) Driving to or from or in the course of the licensee's employment;

21 (iii) Driving to or from a school class or official school activity;

22 (iv) Driving to or from an organized volunteer program; or

23 (v) Driving to or from an opportunity to participate in an athletic  
 24 event or related training session.

25 (4) The hour restriction and the supervision requirement under this  
 26 subsection expire on the date the holder of the provisional license turns 18 years of  
 27 age.

28 (D-1) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING THE LICENSEE'S DRIVING RECORD, AND  
 29 SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL  
 30 IMPOSE A RESTRICTION ON EACH PROVISIONAL DRIVER'S LICENSE PROHIBITING  
 31 THE LICENSEE FROM OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE IF :

32 ~~(I) THE MOTOR VEHICLE IS OCCUPIED BY MORE THAN TWO~~  
 33 ~~PASSENGERS UNDER THE AGE OF 21; OR~~

34 ~~(II) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DRIVER~~  
 35 ~~AND EACH PASSENGER IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE ARE NOT RESTRAINED BY A SEAT~~

1 BELT OR, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 22-412.2 OF THIS ARTICLE, BY A CHILD SAFETY  
2 SEAT.

3 (2) IT IS NOT A VIOLATION OF THE RESTRICTION UNDER PARAGRAPH  
4 ~~(1)(H)~~ (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF AN INDIVIDUAL COVERED BY A MEDICAL  
5 EXCEPTION UNDER § 22-412.2(F) OR § 22-412.3(D) AND (E) OF THIS ARTICLE IS NOT  
6 RESTRAINED.

7 (3) THE RESTRICTIONS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION  
8 EXPIRE ON THE DATE THAT THE HOLDER OF A PROVISIONAL LICENSE TURNS 18  
9 YEARS OF AGE.

11 (a) In this section, "offense" means ~~A LICENSE RESTRICTION VIOLATION~~  
12 ~~UNDER § 16-113(D) OR (D-1) OF THIS TITLE OR a moving violation committed by an~~  
13 ~~individual who:~~

14 (1) ~~Holds a provisional license under § 16-111 of this title; and~~

15 (2) ~~Was convicted of the violation.~~

16 (b) ~~The sanctions under this section are in addition to any other penalty or~~  
17 ~~sanctions that might apply as a result of a moving violation.~~

18 (c) ~~The Administration:~~

19 (1) ~~For a first offense, shall require the offender to attend a driver~~  
20 ~~improvement program under § 16-212 of this subtitle;~~

21 (2) ~~For a second offense, may suspend the offender's provisional license~~  
22 ~~for up to 30 days; and~~

23 (3) ~~For a third or subsequent offense, may suspend or revoke the~~  
24 ~~offender's provisional license for up to 180 days.~~

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding Section  
26 1 of this Act, any individual who holds a provisional driver's license on September 30,  
27 2001, is subject to the license restrictions in effect on that date as long as the  
28 provisional license remains in effect and is not affected by the changes in restrictions  
29 applicable to provisional licenses enacted under Section 1 of this Act.

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
31 October 1, 2001.
