6 7 8 9 10	(A) IN THIS SECTION, "911 SYSTEM" MEANS A TELEPHONE SERVICE WHICH MEETS THE PLANNING GUIDELINES ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 41, § 18-103 OF THE CODE, AND WHICH AUTOMATICALLY CONNECTS A PERSON DIALING THE DIGITS 911 TO AN ESTABLISHED PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT. 911 SYSTEM INCLUDES EQUIPMENT FOR CONNECTING AND OUTSWITCHING 911 CALLS WITHIN A TELEPHONE CENTRAL OFFICE, TRUNKING FACILITIES FROM THE CENTRAL OFFICE TO A PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT, AND EQUIPMENT TO CONNECT 911 CALLS TO THE APPROPRIATE PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCY.

21 22	(a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:
23 24	(1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any other law of this State; or
25 26	(2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the Maryland Vehicle Law.
	(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
