- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- An applicant for registration as a public safety solicitor shall:
- 15 (1) submit to the Secretary of State an application under oath on the
- 16 form the Secretary of State provides for each public safety organization on whose
- 17 behalf the applicant is soliciting in the State;
- 18 (2) consent in writing to the jurisdiction and venue of the Circuit Court
- 19 for Anne Arundel County in actions brought under this title;
- 20 (3) pay to the Secretary of State an application fee of \$100 for
- 21 registration as a public safety solicitor;
- 22 (4) (i) certify that all taxes due from the applicant to the State or to
- 23 Baltimore City or a county of the State during the preceding fiscal year have been
- 24 paid, and all taxes the applicant was required to collect and pay over to the State or

- $1\,$ to Baltimore City or a county of the State during the preceding fiscal year have been
- 2 collected and paid over; or
- 3 (ii) certify that the taxes due from the applicant to the State or to
- 4 Baltimore City or a county are under dispute and the dispute has not been finally
- 5 resolved; and
- 6 (5) provide any other nonproprietary information that the Secretary of
- 7 State requires BY REGULATION.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 9 effect October 1, 2001.
