

1 (e) "[Drivers'] DRIVER EDUCATION school" means a school approved by the 2 Administration to conduct driver education courses in accordance with this subtitle 3 [and Title 15, Subtitle 7 of this article]. 4 16-505. 5 [Subject to the prior endorsement of the regulations by the State (a) 6 Superintendent of Schools, the] THE Administration shall, IN CONSULTATION WITH 7 THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, adopt and enforce regulations not 8 inconsistent with this subtitle to implement a standardized driver education program conducted by [licensed drivers'] DRIVER EDUCATION schools under its jurisdiction. Regulations adopted under this section shall be administered by the 10 11 Administration and shall include: 12 (1) Curriculum, equipment, and facility standards for classroom, 13 laboratory, and on-road instruction phases; 14 Minimum student performance standards for an approved driver (2) 15 education program BASED UPON THE STANDARDIZED CURRICULUM APPROVED BY 16 THE ADMINISTRATION, consisting of at least 30 hours of classroom instruction and at 17 least 6 hours of highway driving instruction BASED UPON THE STANDARDIZED 18 CURRICULUM APPROVED BY THE ADMINISTRATION; 19 (3) Standards for the certification of schools and instructors; 20 (4) A system to evaluate the effectiveness of the driver education 21 program; 22 (5) Standards governing the required offering of the driver education 23 program, based on the capacity, enrollment, staff, and facilities of the schools; and 24 Standards for the eligibility of individuals to enroll in the program.
