Rules and regulations formulated by the Board 23 may be adopted and promulgated by the Commissioner of Labor and Industry subject 24 to the approval of the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation in the same 25 manner as rules and regulations of the Occupational Health and Safety Advisory 26 Board. Within 90 days after adoption of the Maryland Building Rehabilitation Code 27 and any subsequent revisions to the Maryland Building Rehabilitation Code by the 28 Department of Housing and Community Development under Article 83B, § 6-503 of 29 the Code, the Board and the Commissioner shall submit proposed regulations to 30 amend the definitions, rules, and regulations to be consistent with the Maryland 31 Building Rehabilitation Code.

The inspection certificate shall be valid for 26 not more than [14]12 months from its date in the case of power boilers and high 27 pressure, high temperature water boilers and [26] 24 months in the case of low 28 pressure steam or vapor heating boilers, hot water heating boilers or hot water supply 29 boilers and pressure vessels, except that, when the Board has granted an extension of 30 the period between certificate inspections as permitted by this subtitle, the certificate 31 shall be valid for a grace period of two months beyond the expiration date of the 32 current certificate. Certificates shall be posted under glass in the room containing the 33 boiler or pressure vessel inspected. If the boiler or pressure vessel is not located 34 within the building, the certificate shall be posted in a location convenient to the 35 boiler or pressure vessel inspected or in any place where it will be accessible to 36 interested parties.

37 (d) No inspection certificate issued for an insured boiler or pressure vessel
38 based upon a report of a special inspector shall be valid after the boiler or pressure
39 vessel for which it was issued shall cease to be insured by a company duly authorized
40 by this State to provide such insurance.

41 (e) The Chief Boiler Inspector or [his] AN authorized [representative]
