4 FOR the purpose of *defining certain terms;* altering certain waiver provisions that

5 apply to certification as a certified professional counselor-alcohol and drug, a

6 certified associate counselor-alcohol and drug, or a certified supervised

7 counselor-alcohol and drug; authorizing an individual to work as a trainee

8 under certain circumstances; clarifying certain provisions relating to prohibited

9 acts related to the practice of alcohol and drug counseling and clinical alcohol

10 and drug counseling; and generally relating to the practice of alcohol and drug

11 counseling and clinical alcohol and drug counseling.

alcoholism counselor, certified drug counselor, or higher, by the Maryland Addiction
Counselor Certification Board, another state, the Certification Commission of the
National Association of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors, or the International
Certification Reciprocity Consortium, or is employed in the capacity of an Addiction
Counselor II or III, or its equivalent, or higher, [if the person is employed by the
State, a political subdivision of the State, or an entity that provides alcohol and drug
counseling services under contract with the State or a political subdivision of the
State] IN AN AGENCY OR FACILITY ACCREDITED BY THE JOINT COMMISSION ON

(a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, an
individual may not practice, attempt to practice, or offer to practice clinical alcohol
and drug counseling, clinical marriage and family therapy, or clinical professional
counseling in the State unless licensed by the Board.

1 (2) Subject to the rules and regulations of the Board, paragraph (1) of 2 this subsection does not apply to:

3 (i) A student working under the supervision of a licensed mental 4 health care provider while pursuing a supervised course of study in counseling that 5 the Board approves as qualifying training and experience under this title; [or]

6 (ii) An individual with a graduate degree in counseling or a related

7 field who is working under the supervision of a mental health care provider duly

8 licensed under this article for the purpose of qualifying for a license under this title;
