17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) There is a program of Economic Development Student Assistance Grants
 awarded under this subtitle for students who pledge to work in fields of geographic or
 critical shortage in this State upon completion of their studies.

24 (b) The purpose of the Program is to:

25 (1) Provide financial assistance to students enrolled at institutions of 26 higher education in the State; and

	(2) Address the economic development needs of the State.
	2 (c) Subject to subsection (c-1) of this section, a recipient of an Economic 3 Development Student Assistance Grant under this subtitle shall:
2	4 (1) Be a resident of the State;
	5 (2) Be selected by the Administration from qualified applicants based on 6 standards established and approved by the Commission;
8	(3) Sign a letter of intent to enroll at an eligible institution in the State in an eligible program as specified for each field in which there is a geographic or critical shortage in this State as provided in this subtitle;
	0 (4) Furnish a guaranteed promissory note to the Commission or its 1 designee with security satisfactory to the Commission;
1	2 (5) After completion of studies in an eligible program, perform the 3 service obligation as specified for each field in which there is a geographic or critical 4 shortage as provided in this subtitle; and
1	5 (6) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish.
1	6 (c-1) The provisions of subsection (c)(4) of this section may be waived by the 7 Commission when a recipient is undergoing extraordinary circumstances as 8 determined by the Commission.
2 2	9 (d) (1) Except [for Educational Excellence Awards granted under § 18-301 0 of this title] AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, a recipient of a 1 grant under this subtitle may not receive any other form of State-sponsored financial 2 assistance.

 34 shall repay the Commission the funds received as set forth in § 18-112 of this title if
 35 the recipient does not:

1(i)Complete the specified degree, attain the licensure or2certification required, or fulfill other requirements as provided in this subtitle; and

3 (ii) Perform the service obligation as specified in each section of 4 this subtitle for 1 year for each year that the recipient has a grant awarded under this 5 subtitle.

6 (2) (i) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the Administration 7 shall waive the repayment of the grant award at the rate of 1 year for each year that 8 the recipient performs the service obligation.

9 (ii) A recipient shall begin repayment at any time during the period 10 that the recipient is no longer performing the service obligation.

11 (3) A recipient may delay repayment as long as the recipient remains a 12 student enrolled at least part time in a degree-granting program.

13 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, repayment shall be 14 made to the State within 6 years after the repayment period begins and shall follow 15 a repayment schedule established by the Administration.

16 (5) The Administration may waive or defer repayment in the event of 17 disability or extended sickness which prevents the recipient from fulfilling the service 18 obligation required under this subtitle.

(f) The repayment of the grant award by a recipient who is not yet required by
the provisions of this subtitle to begin repayment of the award and who accepts
employment that fulfills the service obligation shall be forgiven, for the purposes of
this subtitle, at a rate of 1 year for each year that the recipient performs the service
obligation.

24 (g) The Commission may adopt guidelines or regulations necessary to 25 implement this subtitle.

26 (h) (1) The Commission may restructure an existing Economic Development
27 Student Assistance Grants Program, as necessary, to address the existing critical
28 shortages under the Program.

29 (2) The Commission shall adopt regulations necessary to implement any 30 changes under paragraph (1) of this subsection.

31 (3) The Commission shall notify the General Assembly of any changes32 implemented under this subsection.

(i) Funds for the Economic Development Student Assistance Grants Program34 shall be as provided in the annual budget of the Commission by the Governor.

36 (a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

1 (1) "Eligible organization" means an institution, including a licensed 2 hospital, nursing home, adult day care center, public health agency, home health 3 agency, or other organization authorized by the Secretary of Health and Mental 4 Hygiene.
5 (2) "Eligible institution" means an institution of postsecondary 6 education:
7 (i) Approved to operate by the Maryland Higher Education8 Commission; and
9 (ii) That awards nursing degrees or diplomas.
10 (3) "Nursing shortage area" means a recognized area of nursing service 11 or specialization determined by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to be an 12 area where there exists a shortage of qualified nurses in eligible organizations.
 13 (4) "Nursing student" means a student enrolled in a postsecondary 14 nursing education degree or diploma program at an eligible institution.
15 (5) "Service obligation" means employment as a nurse in a nursing 16 shortage area in an eligible organization.
17 (b) (1) Economic development student assistance grants may be awarded as18 scholarships for nursing students in nursing shortage areas.
19 (2) (i) The nursing scholarship awarded under this section shall be in 20 the amount of tuition and fees not to exceed \$2,400 annually for a full-time student or 21 a prorated award according to the number of credit hours taken by a part-time 22 student.
 23 (ii) Each award shall be renewable on an annual basis up to a 24 maximum amount of \$9,600, if the recipient:
251.Remains a resident of this State;
26 2. Enrolls in an eligible institution;
273.Maintains a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.028 scale or its equivalent; and
294.Makes satisfactory progress toward the nursing degree or30 diploma according to the standards of the eligible institution attended.
31 (c) Each recipient of the nursing scholarship awarded under this section shall:
32 (1) Be a nursing student;
 33 (2) Have a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its 34 equivalent;

1 (3) Be selected by the Administration on a competitive basis from among 2 the qualified applicants based on academic criteria established by the Commission; 3 and

4 (4) Perform the service obligation.

5 (d) (1) Each recipient of a nursing scholarship awarded under this section
6 may be entitled, based on financial need, to an additional grant to meet living costs
7 not to exceed \$2,400 annually for a full-time student or a prorated award according to
8 the number of credit hours taken by a part-time student.

9 (2) Each additional grant shall be renewable on an annual basis up to a 10 maximum amount of \$9,600, if the recipient meets the requirements for continuing 11 the scholarship award under subsection (b)(2)(ii) of this section.

12 (3) The Administration shall require a recipient of a nursing scholarship 13 who seeks an additional grant for living costs to provide information to the 14 Administration sufficient to assure that the student has a definite financial need.

15 (e) The Commission shall establish and publish rules and regulations to 16 administer the grants awarded under this section.

17 (f) Funds for the nursing scholarships awarded under this section shall be as18 provided in the annual budget of the Commission by the Governor.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 July 1, 2001.
