CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Montgomery County - Rehabilitation Opportunities Loan of 2000**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the description of the location of the project in Chapter
4 310 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2000, Montgomery County -
5 Rehabilitation Opportunities Loan of 2000, to be Montgomery County,
6 Maryland; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the
7 Montgomery County - Rehabilitation Opportunities Loan of 2000.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
9 Chapter 310 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2000
10 Section 1(3)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Chapter 310 of the Acts of 2000**

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
17 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
18 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
19 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
20 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
21 architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of Rehabilitation
22 Opportunities, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the
23 acquisition, planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of a facility located

1 in [Clarksburg,] Montgomery County, Maryland, for use in helping developmentally
2 disabled adults enter the workforce.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
4 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety,
5 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
6 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
7 the date it is enacted.
