A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - License Extension

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for

4 Baltimore City under certain circumstances to grant an extension to the life of

5 alcoholic beverages licenses for a period that the Board determines to be

- 6 appropriate due to certain circumstances; and generally relating to alcoholic
- 7 beverages licenses in Baltimore City.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 9 Article 2B Alcoholic Beverages
- 10 Section 10-504(d)
- 11 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 12 (1998 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 16 10-504.

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

17 (d) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Baltimore City.

18 (ii) In this subsection, "Board" means the Board of License
19 Commissioners or the Office of the Comptroller, whichever is the issuing party.

20 (2) 180 days after the holder of any license issued under the provisions of 21 this article has closed the business or ceased active alcoholic beverages business 22 operations of the business for which the license is held, the license shall avaire unless:

22 operations of the business for which the license is held, the license shall expire unless:

- (i) An application for approval of a transfer to another location or
 24 an application for assignment to another person pursuant to § 10-503(d) of this
- 25 subtitle has been approved or is then pending;

26 (ii) An application pursuant to § 10-506 of this subtitle has been 27 approved or is then pending; or

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1 (iii) A written request for a hardship extension, as provided in this 2 subsection, is filed within the 180-day period.
3 (3) The licensee or other appropriate interested parties may make a 4 written request to the Board for an extension of the life of the license due to undue 5 hardship, for a time period of no more than a cumulative period of 360 days after the 6 date of closing or cessation of alcoholic beverages business operations of the business 7 for which the license is held.
8 (4) After a hearing conducted on the extension request, on a finding that 9 undue hardship currently exists causing the closing or cessation of business 10 operations, the Board may grant an extension of the life of the license for a time 11 period not to exceed 360 days as defined in paragraphs (3) and (5) of this subsection.
12 (5) It is the intent of this subsection that the total time period for which 13 a license may be deemed unexpired under paragraph (2) of this subsection is 180 days 14 if no undue hardship extension is granted, and no more than 360 days if an undue 15 hardship extension has been granted. The time period begins at the earlier of the 16 closing of the business or cessation of alcoholic beverages business, and shall be tolled 17 only upon the filing of an application or request described in paragraph (2) of this 18 subsection, the expiration period to begin running again, cumulatively to the time 19 period before the filing of the application or request, upon the occurrence of the later 20 to occur of the following events:
21(i)Final action of the Board granting or denying a request22authorized by paragraph (3) of this subsection;
 23 (ii) Final action of the Board denying an application described 24 under paragraph (2)(i) or (ii) of this subsection; or
25 (iii) Final judgment of the appellate court when judicial review of 26 the Board's action on an application or request authorized by paragraph (2) or (3) of 27 this subsection has been sought, or on dismissal of a petition for judicial review.
 (6) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, IF ALL LICENSE FEES HAVE BEEN PAID TO DATE, THE BOARD MAY GRANT AN EXTENSION OF THE PERIOD THE LICENSE IS DEEMED UNEXPIRED FOR A TIME THAT THE BOARD DETERMINES TO BE APPROPRIATE DUE TO BANKRUPTCY, FIRE, NATURAL DISASTER, DISPLACEMENT BY CONDEMNATION, OR OTHER UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCE.
 [(6)] (7) If an application or request to the Board described in paragraph (2) or (3) of this subsection is withdrawn, there shall be no tolling of the period for automatic expiration of the license and it shall be deemed as if no such application or request was filed.
