CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Higher Education - Student Financial Assistance - Maryland Teacher**
3 **Scholarship**

4 FOR the purpose of expanding the eligibility and renewal requirements for the
5 Maryland Teacher Scholarship to certain part-time students who are pursuing a
6 graduate degree in teaching; and generally relating to the Maryland Teacher
7 Scholarship program.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

10 Section 18-2203 ~~and 18-2205, 18-2205, and 18-2206(a)~~
11 Annotated Code of Maryland
12 (1999 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Education**

16 18-2203.

17 (a) The Administration shall annually select eligible students and offer a
18 scholarship to each student selected to be used at an eligible institution of their
19 choice.

20 (b) A recipient of the Maryland Teacher Scholarship shall:

- 1 (1) Be a Maryland resident;
- 2 (2) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, be accepted for
3 admission [as a full-time student or be] OR currently enrolled at an eligible
4 institution as a full-time UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT OR A FULL-TIME OR
5 PART-TIME GRADUATE student pursuing a course of study or program in an academic
6 discipline leading to a Maryland professional teacher's certificate;
- 7 (3) (i) For a student currently enrolled in high school, have earned a
8 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent in core
9 curriculum courses at the time of application; or
- 10 (ii) For a student currently enrolled as a full-time undergraduate
11 student, have maintained a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and have
12 been making satisfactory progress toward a degree in an academic discipline leading
13 to a Maryland professional teacher's certificate;
- 14 (4) Sign a letter of intent to perform the service obligation upon
15 completion of the recipient's required studies;
- 16 (5) Accept any other conditions attached to the award; and
- 17 (6) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish.
- 18 (c) A recipient of the Maryland Teacher Scholarship may not[:
- 19 (1) Be currently enrolled in an eligible institution;
- 20 (2) Be a college graduate; or
- 21 (3) Hold] HOLD a Maryland professional teacher's certificate.
- 22 (d) (1) Applicants who are secondary school students shall provide a high
23 school transcript after completion of the first semester of their senior year.
- 24 (2) Applicants who are currently enrolled in an eligible institution shall
25 provide the most recent college transcript, or if not applicable, the applicant may
26 submit a final high school transcript.
- 27 (3) Applicants who are not currently enrolled in an eligible institution,
28 but who are high school graduates shall provide a final high school transcript.
- 29 (4) Applicants who are high school graduates and are not currently
30 enrolled in an eligible institution, but have completed some courses at an eligible
31 institution, shall provide the most recent college transcript.
- 32 (5) Applicants who are not currently enrolled in an eligible institution,
33 but who are college graduates shall provide a final college transcript.

2 The annual scholarship award shall be in the amount of:

3 (1) \$2,000 for [a] AN UNDERGRADUATE student enrolled at a 2-year
4 eligible institution; [or]

5 (2) \$5,000 for a FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE student
6 enrolled in a 4-year eligible institution; OR

7 (3) \$2,500 FOR A PART-TIME GRADUATE STUDENT ENROLLED AT A
8 4-YEAR ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION.

9 18-2206.

10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, each recipient of a
11 Maryland teacher scholarship may renew the award three times if the recipient:

12 (1) Continues to be a resident of the State;

13 (2) Continues to be a full-time student OR PART-TIME GRADUATE
14 STUDENT at an eligible institution [and takes at least 12 semester hours of courses
15 each semester or its equivalent] as determined by the Administration;

16 (3) Has achieved a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0
17 scale and maintains this minimum cumulative grade point average throughout the
18 remainder of this award, or failing to do so, provides evidence of extenuating
19 circumstances;

20 (4) In the judgment of the institution, is making satisfactory progress
21 toward a degree; and

22 (5) Maintains the standards of the institution.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
24 effect July 1, 2001.
