16 17	(f) (1) A person convicted of theft where the property or services that was the subject of the theft has a value of \$500 or greater is guilty of a felony and shall restore the property taken to the owner or pay him the value of the property or services, and be fined not more than [\$1,000] \$25,000, or be imprisoned for not more than 15 years, or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court.
21	(2) A person convicted of theft where the property or services that was the subject of the theft has a value of less than \$5,000 \$500 is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall restore the property taken to the owner or pay him the value of the property or services, and be fined not more than [\$500] \$5,000, or be imprisoned for not more

- 1 than 18 months, or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court;
- 2 however, all actions or prosecutions for theft where the property or services that was
- 3 the subject of the theft has a value of less than \$500 shall be commenced within 2
- 4 years after the commission of the offense.
