	FOR the purpose of authorizing a school crossing guard to direct and regulate traffic under certain circumstances in a crosswalk; authorizing a school crossing guard to signal, stop, or otherwise direct or regulate traffic to permit the safe crossing of pedestrians in certain areas a crosswalk; prohibiting a person from willfully disobeying a lawful order or direction of a school crossing guard; requiring certain local agencies to establish a training program for a school crossing guard; authorizing certain persons to assign additional traffic control duties to a school crossing guard; authorizing a school crossing guard to assist a police officer in regulating traffic at certain times; requiring a school crossing guard to record certain information and file certain reports if the school crossing guard witnesses certain traffic violations; authorizing certain law enforcement agencies to issue certain warnings for certain violations providing a certain penalty for a violation of this Act; and generally relating to the regulation of traffic by school crossing guards.
