"Motor home" means a motor vehicle that is designed and constructed primarily 4 to provide living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use. 5 23-206.2. A motor vehicle for which special registration plates have been issued 6 7 under § 13-616 of this article, is exempt from the mandatory inspections required by 8 this subtitle if: 9 (i) All of the owners of the motor vehicle meet the disability 10 requirements of § 13-616(a)(1) of this article; 11 (ii) The motor vehicle is driven less than 5,000 miles or less 12 annually; and 13 (iii) The exemption is not otherwise prohibited by federal law. - 15 OVER 10,000 POUNDS <u>AND THAT IS NOT POWERED BY A COMPRESSION IGNITION</u>
- 16 ENGINE IS NOT SUBJECT TO ANY EMISSIONS STANDARDS OR TO ANY TESTS OR
- 17 INSPECTIONS UNDER THE EMISSIONS CONTROL PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER
- 18 TRANSIENT MASS-EMISSION TESTING AS DESCRIBED IN § 23-202(D)(1)(I) OF THIS
- 19 SUBTITLE.
- 20 [(c)] (D) The Administrator may adopt regulations as necessary to administer 21 or enforce the provisions of this section.
