- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

THE SECRETARY MAY USE INFORMATION DEVELOPED, COMPILED, OR 24 (B)

- 30 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE STATUS OF THE STROKE
- 31 PREVENTION, DETECTION, AND TREATMENT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any programs established under the provisions of this Act shall be funded as provided for in the State budget.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
