- 19 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the operation of the
- 20 Program. The report shall include information on the number of individuals served,
- 21 use rates, and expenditures under the Program. The report also shall address the
- 22 impact of the Program on reducing unmet pharmaceutical drug needs among the
- 23 elderly and shall recommend programmatic changes if appropriate.
