- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - State Government**

- 15 15-602.
- Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, a statement filed under §
- 17 15-601, § 15-603, § 15-604, or § 15-605 of this subtitle shall:
- be filed with the Ethics Commission; 18 (1)
- 19 (2) be filed under oath;
- 20 (3) be filed on or before April 30 of each year;
- 21 (4) cover the calendar year immediately preceding the year of filing; and
- contain the information required in § 15-607 of this subtitle. 22 (5)
- 23 Notwithstanding subsection (a)(1) of this section, a statement filed by a
- 24 member of the General Assembly shall be filed in duplicate with the Joint Ethics
- 25 Committee.

In addition to the statement filed under § 15-601 of this subtitle, a

2 member of the General Assembly shall file a preliminary disclosure on or before the 3 seventh day of the regular legislative session if there will be a substantial change in 4 the statement covering the calendar year immediately preceding the year of filing, as 5 compared to the next preceding calendar year. 6 A member of the General Assembly whose statement under § 15-601 7 of this subtitle will not contain a substantial change is not required to file a 8 preliminary disclosure under paragraph (1) of this subsection. 9 The Joint Ethics Committee shall: (3) prescribe the form of a preliminary disclosure under this 10 (i) 11 subsection; and 12 (ii) determine which aspects of financial disclosure are subject to 13 this subsection. 14 (4) A preliminary disclosure shall be filed and maintained, and may be 15 disclosed, in the same manner prescribed for a statement filed under § 15-601 of this 16 subtitle. 17 The Ethics Commission shall develop procedures under which a (d)] (C) 18 statement under this subtitle may be filed electronically and without additional cost 19 to the individual who files the statement. 20 SECTION 2.
