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## **SENATE BILL 294**

- 1 (b) (1) (I) Unless a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the 2 construction is first obtained from the Commission, a person may not begin 3 construction in the State of a generating station.
- NOTWITHSTANDING SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A 5 CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY IS NOT REQUIRED FOR THE
- 6 CONSTRUCTION OF A GENERATING STATION THAT PRODUCES ONLY ON-SITE
- 7 GENERATED ELECTRICITY AND GENERATES LESS THAN 100 MEGAWATTS.
- 8 Unless a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the (2)
- 9 construction is first obtained from the Commission, and the Commission has found
- 10 that the capacity is necessary to ensure a sufficient supply of electricity to customers
- 11 in the State, a person may not exercise a right of condemnation in connection with the

- 13 Unless a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the
- 14 construction is first obtained from the Commission, an electric company may not
- 15 begin construction of an overhead transmission line that is designed to carry a voltage
- 16 in excess of 69,000 volts or exercise a right of condemnation with the construction.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 18 October 1, 2001.
