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SENATE BILL 315 1 **Article - State Finance and Procurement** 2 13-111. 3 IN THIS SECTION, "UNSOLICITED PROPOSAL" MEANS AN OFFER BY A (A) 4 VENDOR OR PRODUCER OF GOODS OR SERVICES WHICH WAS NOT INITIALLY 5 SOLICITED BY THE UNIT OF STATE GOVERNMENT WHICH EVENTUALLY CONTRACTS 6 FOR THOSE GOODS OR SERVICES. 7 A UNIT OF STATE GOVERNMENT OTHERWISE LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO (B) 8 CONTRACT FOR GOODS OR SERVICES MAY AWARD A CONTRACT FOR GOODS OR 9 SERVICES BASED ON AN UNSOLICITED PROPOSAL WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH THE 10 REOUIRED PROCEDURES FOR SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT UNDER § 13-108 OF THIS 11 SUBTITLE OR THE PROCEDURES FOR PROCUREMENT THROUGH COMPETITIVE 12 SEALED BIDS OR PROPOSALS UNDER §§ 13-103 AND 13-104 OF THIS SUBTITLE IF: 13 (1) THERE IS A STATE NEED FOR THE GOODS OR SERVICES; 14 THE CONTRACTING UNIT: (2) (I) CERTIFIES TO THE BOARD THAT: 15 1. 1 **Article - State Government** 2 15-508. 3 (a) [An] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, AN 4 individual or a person that employs an individual who assists an executive unit in the 5 drafting of specifications, an invitation for bids, a request for proposals for a procurement, or the selection or award made in response to an invitation for bids or 7 request for proposals may not: 8 (1) submit a bid or proposal for that procurement; or 9 assist or represent another person, directly or indirectly, who is 10 submitting a bid or proposal for that procurement. 11 For purposes of subsection (a) of this section, assisting in the drafting of 12 specifications, an invitation for bids, or a request for proposals for a procurement does 13 not include: 14 providing descriptive literature such as catalogue sheets, brochures, (1) 15 technical data sheets, or standard specification "samples", whether requested by an 16 executive agency or provided on an unsolicited basis; 17 submitting written comments on a specification prepared by an 18 agency or on a solicitation for a bid or proposal when comments are solicited from two 19 or more persons as part of a request for information or a prebid or preproposal 20 process; 21 providing specifications for a sole source procurement made in 22 accordance with § 13-107 of the State Finance and Procurement Article; or 23 providing architectural and engineering services for programming, (4) 24 master planning, or other project planning services.
