- 19 WHEREAS, The Commission on Transportation Investment found that the
- 20 State will have \$27 billion in unmet transportation needs over the next 20 years; and
- WHEREAS, Airports are relying increasingly on the private sector to reduce 21
- 22 costs and improve the quality and range of services offered; and
- 23 WHEREAS, A recent survey by the United States Government Accounting
- 24 Office found that 90% of the people working at 69 of the nation's largest airports,
- 25 providing services such as airline ticketing, baggage handling, cleaning, retail, and
- 26 ground concessions, are employed by private companies; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Local and state governments around the country are examining
- 28 alternatives for airport governance to mitigate increasing public expenditures; now,

- 3 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL BE APPOINTED BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2001.
- 4 (C) THE GOVERNOR SHALL SELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM THE MEMBERSHIP OF 5 THE COMMISSION.

- 6 (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROVIDE AN INTERIM REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS
- 7 AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246
- 8 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE
- 9 JANUARY 1, 2002.
- 10 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROVIDE A FINAL REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS AND
- 11 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF
- 12 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE

- 15 July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June
- 16 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 17 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
