19 (A) THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE ASSOCIATION OF

20 MARYLAND HOSPITALS AND HEALTH SYSTEMS AND THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION

21 OF HOSPITAL SECURITY AND SAFETY DIRECTORS, SHALL DEVELOP A UNIFORM SET

3 (C) EACH HOSPITAL IN MARYLAND SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF 4 THE UNIFORM <u>SET OF EMERGENCY</u> SECURITY <u>CODE</u> <u>CODES</u> FOR HOSPITALS WITHIN 5 2 YEARS OF THE ADOPTION OF THE REGULATIONS BY THE SECRETARY.
