- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 IN THIS SUBTITLE, "ELECTRONIC TRANSACTIONS" MEANS THE USE OF, ACCESS
- 20 TO, OR COMMUNICATION INVOLVING THE INTERNET, WORLD WIDE WEB, OR
- 21 WIRELESS OR SIMILAR TECHNOLOGIES.

- 2 (A) THERE IS AN ELECTRONIC TRANSACTION EDUCATION, ADVOCACY, AND
- 3 MEDIATION UNIT IN THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.
- 4 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE UNIT IS TO PROTECT THE PRIVACY OF
- 5 INDIVIDUALS' PERSONAL INFORMATION AND TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC FROM
- 6 UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR PRACTICES IN ELECTRONIC TRANSACTIONS.
- 7 (C) THE UNIT SHALL:
- 8 (1) RECEIVE COMPLAINTS CONCERNING:
- 9 (I) ANY PERSONS OBTAINING, COMPILING, MAINTAINING, USING,
- 10 DISCLOSING, OR DISPOSING OF PERSONAL INFORMATION IN A MANNER THAT MAY
- 11 BE POTENTIALLY UNLAWFUL OR VIOLATE A STATED PRIVACY POLICY RELATING TO
- 12 THAT INDIVIDUAL; AND
- 13 (II) UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR PRACTICES IN ELECTRONIC
- 14 TRANSACTIONS;
- 15 (2) PROVIDE INFORMATION AND ADVICE TO THE PUBLIC ON EFFECTIVE
- 16 WAYS OF HANDLING COMPLAINTS THAT INVOLVE VIOLATIONS OF:
- 17 (I) PRIVACY RELATED LAWS, INCLUDING IDENTITY THEFT AND
- 18 IDENTITY FRAUD; OR
- 19 (II) UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR PRACTICES IN ELECTRONIC
- 20 TRANSACTIONS;
- 21 (3) REFER COMPLAINTS WHERE APPROPRIATE TO LOCAL, STATE, OR
- 22 FEDERAL AGENCIES THAT ARE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST THE PUBLIC WITH PRIVACY
- 23 AND ELECTRONIC TRANSACTION RELATED COMPLAINTS;
- 24 (4) DEVELOP INFORMATION AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND
- 25 MATERIALS TO FOSTER PUBLIC UNDERSTANDING AND RECOGNITION OF THE ISSUES
- 26 RELATED TO PRIVACY IN ELECTRONIC COMMERCE AND UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR
- 27 PRACTICES IN ELECTRONIC TRANSACTIONS:
- 28 (5) IDENTIFY CONSUMER PROBLEMS IN, AND FACILITATE THE
- 29 DEVELOPMENT AND USE OF BEST PRACTICES BY PERSONS ENGAGED IN

- 1 (I) IDENTITY THEFT AND OTHER PRIVACY RELATED CRIMES, AND,
- 2 AS NECESSARY, COORDINATE WITH LOCAL, STATE, AND FEDERAL LAW
- 3 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE INVESTIGATION OF SIMILAR CRIMES; AND
- 4 (II) UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR PRACTICES IN ELECTRONIC

- 14 October 1, 2001.
