CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City ~~Department of Public Works~~ Parking Authority - Residential**
3 **Parking Permits**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Executive Director of the ~~Executive~~ Baltimore
5 City ~~Department of Public Works~~ Parking Authority to issue a residential
6 parking permit to a person who owns and occupies residential property in the
7 residential parking permit area regardless of whether the person would
8 otherwise qualify for the permit under certain provisions of law; and generally
9 relating to residential parking permits in Baltimore City.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article - Transportation**

4 21-1003.1.

5 (a) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A local
6 authority may not issue a residential parking permit to the owner of a vehicle to be
7 valid for a period in excess of 30 days unless the owner provides satisfactory evidence
8 that:

9 (1) The vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in
10 the State; or

11 (2) The owner of the vehicle has obtained under § 13-402.1 of this
12 article:

13 (i) A nonresident permit; or

14 (ii) A complimentary guest card.

15 (b) If a residential parking permit area is established as a result of the
16 construction of a professional sports facility that seats 45,000 or more people, a local
17 authority may not charge a fee for the issuance of a permit to park in that area.

18 (C) IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY
19 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS PARKING AUTHORITY MAY ISSUE, ON A ~~CASE BY~~
20 ~~CASE BASIS SHOWING OF EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP AND OCCUPANCY~~, A
21 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A PERSON WHO OWNS AND OCCUPIES
22 RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY IN THE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT AREA REGARDLESS
23 OF WHETHER THE PERSON WOULD OTHERWISE QUALIFY FOR A RESIDENTIAL
24 PARKING PERMIT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
