BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 **Article - Transportation** 4 21-1003.1. 5 [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A local (a) 6 authority may not issue a residential parking permit to the owner of a vehicle to be 7 valid for a period in excess of 30 days unless the owner provides satisfactory evidence 8 that: 9 The vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in (1) 10 the State; or 11 (2) The owner of the vehicle has obtained under § 13-402.1 of this 12 article: 13 (i) A nonresident permit; or 14 (ii) A complimentary guest card. 15 If a residential parking permit area is established as a result of the (b) 16 construction of a professional sports facility that seats 45,000 or more people, a local 17 authority may not charge a fee for the issuance of a permit to park in that area. 18 IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY 19 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS PARKING AUTHORITY MAY ISSUE, ON A CASE BY 20 CASE BASIS SHOWING OF EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP AND OCCUPANCY, A 21 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A PERSON WHO OWNS AND OCCUPIES
