A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City Department of Public Works - Residential Parking Permits**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Director of the Baltimore City Department of
4 Public Works to issue a residential parking permit to a person who owns
5 residential property in the residential parking permit area regardless of
6 whether the person would otherwise qualify for the permit under certain
7 provisions of law; and generally relating to residential parking permits in
8 Baltimore City.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article - Transportation**

17 21-1003.1.

18 (a) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A local
19 authority may not issue a residential parking permit to the owner of a vehicle to be
20 valid for a period in excess of 30 days unless the owner provides satisfactory evidence
21 that:

22 (1) The vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in
23 the State; or

24 (2) The owner of the vehicle has obtained under § 13-402.1 of this
25 article:

26 (i) A nonresident permit; or

27 (ii) A complimentary guest card.

1 (b) If a residential parking permit area is established as a result of the
2 construction of a professional sports facility that seats 45,000 or more people, a local
3 authority may not charge a fee for the issuance of a permit to park in that area.

4 (C) IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY
5 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS MAY ISSUE, ON A CASE BY CASE BASIS, A
6 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A PERSON WHO OWNS RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY
7 IN THE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT AREA REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE
8 PERSON WOULD OTHERWISE QUALIFY FOR A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT UNDER
9 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2001.
