# Baltimore City Department of Public Works Parking Authority - Residential Parking Permits

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Director of the Executive Baltimore City

- 5 Department of Public Works <u>Parking Authority</u> to issue a residential parking
- 6 permit to a person who owns <u>and occupies</u> residential property in the residential
- 7 parking permit area regardless of whether the person would otherwise qualify
- 8 for the permit under certain provisions of law; and generally relating to
- 9 residential parking permits in Baltimore City.

## 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Transportation

18 21-1003.1.

19 (a) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A local

20 authority may not issue a residential parking permit to the owner of a vehicle to be

21 valid for a period in excess of 30 days unless the owner provides satisfactory evidence

22 that:

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- 1 (1)The vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in 2 the State; or
- (2)The owner of the vehicle has obtained under § 13-402.1 of this 4 article:
- - (i) A nonresident permit; or
- A complimentary guest card. 6 (ii)

7 If a residential parking permit area is established as a result of the (b) 8 construction of a professional sports facility that seats 45,000 or more people, a local authority may not charge a fee for the issuance of a permit to park in that area. 9

10 (C) IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY 11 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS PARKING AUTHORITY MAY ISSUE, ON A CASE BY 12 CASE BASIS SHOWING OF EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP AND OCCUPANCY, A 13 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A PERSON WHO OWNS AND OCCUPIES 14 RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY IN THE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT AREA REGARDLESS 15 OF WHETHER THE PERSON WOULD OTHERWISE QUALIFY FOR A RESIDENTIAL 16 PARKING PERMIT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October July 1, 2001.

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
